What you will learn: Review the cycle of violence in relationship to perpetrator dynamics, transference/countertransference issues in working with perpetrators, cultural considerations, assessment and safety case planning with perpetrators, treatment of perpetrators and coordination of case planning activities.

How you will benefit:

- Identify the “typologies” of perpetrators, as cited by research on batterers of DV
- Identify the distinctions of intimate partner violence
- Demonstrate an assessment and case plan with the focus on intervention for the batterer that addresses safety of the child and victim

Raymond Cameron earned his B.A. in Philosophy from the University of California, San Diego, and his M.A. in Marriage and Family Therapy from the University of San Diego.

Raymond has been specializing in the field of Family Violence since 1995 including designing and implementing outcome research on shelter effectiveness, working with victims and families experiencing family violence, as well as treating perpetrators in Family Violence Perpetrator Rehabilitation Programs.
