II. February Meeting Notes Approved – Change CVUSD student total to 16,000-18,000. Separate data bases have different figures.	Approved
III. CVUSD Wellness Council Updates <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • KNOW MORE is a human trafficking program from Pt. Loma University that was presented to 8th graders at Greenfield Middle School. Tami shared with the group that although this was a wonderful program and that the students loved it, she was disappointed in the parent involvement at the community/parent presentation on March 12th. There were only a few people who attended and one parent had to leave because she brought a young student. We talked about ways to engage the parents next time. • CVUSD Health & Wellness Fair- This event was well attended and there were over 30 vendor/resource tables. It was a great strategy to hold the open house at the same time as the resource fair, bringing more parents out to participate. It was difficult to get people to attend the presentations and only four staff participated. Next time we would like to engage more neighbors, along with the parents, promoting it a little more broadly. Mayor Wells attended and was impressed with the event. 	No action required.
IV. Coordinator Report- Access to Transportation in El Cajon—SANDAG & the City of El Cajon Transit Center Draft Plan Carol presented the draft of the Transit Center Development Plan for the City of El Cajon. She has been participating with the community work groups since 2016 with this project. The plan focuses on rezoning for additional housing, narrower streets with landscaping and traffic calming solutions, active transportation options and better access to the transit center. This led to a discussion on pedestrian safety with areas around schools. The group is excited to hear more about funding and development. The plan will go before the City Council in April to be adopted.	No action required.
