Meeting Purpose: *To engage service-delivery staff and community members in resource sharing, networking, and action to benefit the children, youth and families of the El Cajon Community.*

I. Welcoming Remarks & Collaborative Updates

II. Services for Homeless Families (Panel Presentation)

We welcomed 5 individuals who shared information and answered questions about services for homeless families. The presenters were:

- Denise Valence Schoolcraft of East County Transitional Living Center

Offering services in 2 programs, Christian-based and non-Christian based. They have emergency services for individuals in El Cajon and can help with a wide-range of services for families who are experiencing homelessness.

- Brandy Gross of Volunteers of America (VOA)

Target individuals who are experiencing homelessness due to a mental disorder.

- Russ Lurcook of Salvation Army

Offer help on an individualized and emergency basis to homeless individuals and families. Trunk ministry provides food, hygiene kits and conversation by volunteers and Senior meal program 11-1 everyday is also available to those who are homeless.

- Rosemary Johnston of Interfaith Shelter Network

Rotational shelter program run by volunteers and faith congregations – referrals in East Region go through Crisis House and VOA. 8 week maximum stay from January-May. Location rotates every 2 weeks, provides dinner and breakfast – must be under medical supervision and in control if drug/alcohol or mental issue has been a problem.

- Carla Navarro of Home Start

Family Self Sufficiency Program can provide help with employment, case management, as well as emergency food and clothing. Appointments are required.
