Monthly Council Meeting Notes
September 6, 2011

Purpose of the Council:

“To engage direct service staff and community partners in resource sharing, networking, joint planning and action around issues that benefit the youth and families of the El Cajon community, consistent with the mission, vision and priorities of the Collaborative.”

AGENDA ITEMS/ DISCUSSION

I. Welcoming Remarks-

LaVonna Connelly, El Cajon Collaborative (ECC) Coordinator, thanked everyone for coming and for their patience in waiting for the resolution of our technical difficulties, and began the meeting at 12:40.

II. Collaborative Updates-

LaVonna briefly reviewed the following Collaborative updates:

Strategy Work Priorities fro 2011-2012: LaVonna reviewed the Collaborative’s Strategic Objectives and stated that the Collaborative would consider involvement in activities aligned with these priorities.

Open Positions on ECC Leadership Teams: LaVonna announced that there were open positions on the Collaborative’s Executive Team in the business and faith sectors and that there were open positions on the Core Team in the parent and community sectors.

Newcomer Support Work Group: LaVonna shared that the Newcomer Support Work Group was in the process of identifying new leaders and welcomed involvement. Next meeting will be Thursday, Oct 6th.

Summary of July’s Council Survey: LaVonna shared a summary of the information she collected from Council attendees at July’s meeting. She stated that more detailed information was available.

Office Space for Lease at Little House: LaVonna announced that there are still four offices available.

New Council Facilitator: LaVonna announced that the new Council Facilitator for September 2011 through July 2012 will be **Veronica Mikho, National Conflict Resolution Center**. Nominations for the FY 2012-2013 Facilitator will be solicited in June 2012. Nominees must be regular Council attendees.

III. Presentation-

Bridget Lambert and Veronica Mikho, of National Conflict Resolution Center (NCRC), presented information on the mediation process and the mediation trainings/services their agency offers. NCRC Mediators are trained professionals, and the mediation process takes place in 1-2 meetings to resolve a dispute. Trainings are open to the public and are available in English or Spanish. Groups of 15 or more can call NCRC to schedule training. Individuals can contact NCRC for open seats in trainings. Issues

and disputes related to felonies, divorces or custody proceedings are excluded from NCRC services. Trainings are available for businesses or communities.
